## Time for a spiritual spring clean

How is your Lent progressing?

It is a time which many associate with giving up something, such as alcohol or chocolate but do not get much further than that. Over the centuries fasting, prayer and self-denial have featured strongly. Perhaps you started off on Ash Wednesday by receiving ashes on your forehead. These ashes are traditionally made by burning palm crosses from the previous year's Palm Sunday. Palm Sunday celebrates Jesus' triumphant entry into Jerusalem, so when the palm crosses are converted to ashes, we are reminded that suffering and pain on the way to crucifixion swiftly followed this triumph. It is also a reminder to us of our mortality and the fragility of life.

Lent is a time of preparation and reflection. Jesus spent forty days and nights in the desert as preparation for his work, fasting and praying. Fasting is now rather fashionable, all with the purpose of cleansing the body of toxins and losing weight. Prayer and fasting focus the mind on God rather than on the material things of life, an opportunity for spiritual spring cleaning and a realigning of our priorities.

We get on the treadmill of life, some habits are good, others are not. Just as our homes need more than a quick dust, so do our lives. A deep clean can sometimes be painful but the outcome is always good.


The word 'Lent' means 'lengthening' and relates to the lengthening of the days as we move into Spring. The snowdrops are being followed by crocuses, hellebores, daffodils and narcissi, irises, the catkins are waving in the breeze. The lambs are being born, new life is stirring all around us. There is more light and with light comes hope.

This year's Lent reflections from the Church of England are Draw Near – life giving habits for Lent – they are available on the Everyday Faith App which can be downloaded.

There is also a Lent challenge of 40 acts for families with a wallchart to help keep track of progress - [dn-family-wallchart-v2.pdf](#). We are encouraged to give time, give encouragement, practise a generous way of living that helps build love, hope and joy in the communities we live in.



## WEE ALBION NOTEBOOK

### THE HALSEWELL SHIPWRECK

Ancient timbers washed ashore at Studland Bay are a reminder that there have been many ships wrecked along the Dorset coast. One of the worst disasters was 250 years ago when, in the early hours of January 6, 1776, a blizzard and hurricane-force winds drove the ill-fated Halsewell, East-Indiaman, onto precipitous cliffs between Seacombe and Winspit, on the Isle of Purbeck.

The Rev. M Jones, vicar of Worth Matravers recorded: *'Never did happen so complete a wreck. The ship long before day-break was shattered to pieces... It proved fatal to 168 persons, among whom were the captain, two of his daughters, two nieces and three other young ladies. Eighty-two men, by the exertion and humanity of the inhabitants and neighbouring quarries, at the imminent hazard of their own lives, were saved.'*

The disaster prompted an outpouring of poetry, prose, paintings, articles and music. Chapbooks, broadsides, books and talks carried the tragic tale around the country. Charles Dickens used it in a short story, King George III visited the scene, and the poet laureate, Henry James Pye, was moved to scribe:

*Even the stern mariner, whose doubtful hand  
Just grasps the summit of the wish'd for land  
While scarce his thoughts the sense of safety know,  
Escap'd from rocks above, and waves below,  
Amid the conflict keen of hope and fear,  
Hears their last cries still vibrant in his ear;  
Feels their keen anguish 'midst his dearest strife,  
And mourns their sufferings while he pants for life.*



The rain has been relentless at times lately with only the odd day of sunshine. The recent flooding across the parish has been extremely serious and unprecedented in several areas. Our thoughts are with all residents whose homes have been affected by flooding.

The Parish Council will be looking at what actions it can take to raise awareness and help residents be better prepared for future flooding events, including sharing information about personal flood plans and reporting procedures. All our current supply of sandbags is exhausted, and we are looking at acquiring more empty sandbags and a storage facility that would be available 7 days a week. Also please do not drive through flood water, as there could be hidden potholes and debris, and you could force bow waves of water into people's houses causing flooding.

**The Annual Litter Pick will take place on Saturday 28<sup>th</sup> March at 2:00pm** starting as usual at the Memorial Hall where you will be able to collect your equipment. We will be providing refreshments afterwards in the Memorial Hall. Please do come along and support, and let's hope the weather is kind like last year. As part of the Parish Climate Change Action Plan, we are launching a **Grow at Home Scheme** this Spring. Initially seed starter packs which will include seeds, trays, and compost will be offered to residents who are interested in growing their own fruit and vegetables at home. ## **March** ..... ‘Comes in like a lion and out like a lamb.’

I am sure we have all heard this saying. Our ancestors believed that there should be a balance in weather and life, so, if a month came in bad (roaring like a lion), it should go out good and calm (docile, like a lamb). We know from experience that March can be a very changeable month so this is not always the case.

Another well-known saying is ‘Mad as a March hare.’ As for most wildlife, spring is the hares’ breeding season. In March and April, male hares will be looking for females to mate. Contrary to popular belief, it is not two male rivals that box. The males will literally chase females who will often get fed up with so much attention - that's when the boxing match begins! She turns around and wallops the male to discourage him and sometimes to test his stamina.



It looks like they're boxing because the female and male are on their back legs, hitting each other with their front paws. They can even pull out fur!

It's not just boxing they are good at. Hares are true Olympic athletes, as they're also amazing sprinters. They can reach 40 miles per hour when they run at full pelt. ‘Chasing’ hares are usually dominant males seeing off another male in a fit of jealousy.

They don't dig burrows as rabbits do, but instead make a small depression in the ground among long grass – known as a form. Hares can be seen throughout Dorset although their numbers have declined dramatically due to changes in agriculture.

Before Christianity in the British Isles, the hare, like the cat, was thought to be a witch in disguise. This witch could only be killed with a silver bullet. Sadly hares are not protected even though their numbers have declined so it is still legal to shoot them today.

## Kingston Lacy Estate News

March seems too early to talk about Easter, but with Good Friday falling on 3 April, Kingston Lacy's Easter adventures will be kicking off from Saturday 21 March this year.

There'll be a variety of different activities to try, with no age barrier to stop you! Bunny ears are optional (we have found that more adults than children are happy to wear them) and, of course, there will be chocolate. Trails cost £3.50 (normal admission applies) and we are crossing all our fingers that the weather is kind.

This is also your last chance to see the slow looking exhibition Meet Rembrandt, which moves on to pastures new on 22 March. We've had excellent comments from visitors, so do come along if you haven't already been. On 10 March, there's also a chance to hear the National Trust's National Conservator for Visual Arts on the science of conservation – Rebecca Hellen will be sharing not only her experience of working on this portrait, but also exploring more widely what can be learnt about painting from conservation work. Book online – tickets cost £15.



Outdoors, you'll hopefully have seen the beautiful work being done on the hedges along the Beech Avenue. There are two other expert hedgers working on the estate to lay several miles of hedge; this is part of a long-term plan to thicken up hedgerows that have become too thin to provide good habitat for bird, butterflies and small mammals such as dormice. We are continuing to plant with a variety of species, providing not only nest and hibernation sites but also protection from predators and rich sources of food. This work will also help stem a decline in rural skills, with our volunteers learning from one of the hedgelayers as they work alongside.
