

RIDE+STRIDE for St Mary's Sturminster Marshall

Every year Dorset Historic Churches Trust runs a sponsored Ride+Stride event and invites everybody to take part.

This heritage organisation raises money to support the repair and maintenance of our historic church buildings. Half of the money raised is returned to the nominated Church or Chapel and Dorset Historic Churches Trust use the balance to give grants to maintain historic Dorset churches.

Taking part

- ✓ People walk, run, ride a bicycle, a horse or a mobility scooter and plan a route to visit Dorset churches.
- ✓ There is no specified number of churches to be visited between 10am and 6pm. The start and finish can be at any location – a good opportunity to explore a new area of Dorset.
- ✓ This is for individuals or groups of people. Anyone can take part.
- ✓ It could be a family day out. Children are welcome if accompanied by an adult.

If British Summer Time and warmer days mean you will be visiting one of Dorset and Wiltshire's local heathlands or outdoors spaces to enjoy the wildlife and wilderness, please take a picnic.

Dorset & Wiltshire Fire and Rescue Service (DWFRS) is encouraging residents and visitors to bring a picnic and not a barbecue when out and about. Warmer and breezy weather increases the risk of accidental or deliberate fires in our open spaces.

A wildfire can move at speeds faster than an Olympic sprinter, so we are asking everyone to follow some simple steps:

- If you are enjoying our open spaces when a fire occurs, get to a safe place and call the fire service on 999 immediately, with as much information as possible.
- Consider downloading and using What3Words to identify your exact location.
- You can also help by reporting any anti-social behaviour on our heaths and open spaces to the Police on 101.

Landowners and land managers are also advised, where possible, to be prepared for fires and ensure that fire breaks are cut and well maintained with any cut grasses and vegetation removed from the site.

It is a danger to the health of the families that use this vital community asset. As the situation does not appear to be improving, we will have look into employing the Dog Warden to assist with this issue, and as mentioned last month this will have to be funded from Parish Council funds. Our annual play area inspection has been completed. We are pleased to report the equipment is in good condition and safe, with only a few minor repairs needed. The benches at Station Road and Trafalgar Green have now been fully refurbished and are ready to be enjoyed. It was decided at the last Council meeting a 20mph zone would be applied for and to include the whole of the village. A new 'Please Slow Down' sign is now in place on Newton Road to help address speeding concerns. I hope you have put the date in your diary for the next community litter pick on Saturday 4th October 2025. This will start at 2.00pm at the Memorial Hall, and as usual equipment will be provided along with refreshments for when you have finished. At our July meeting, the Parish Council awarded grants to local organisations and approved the annual Community Bus subsidy. Thank you to all those supporting our Parish!







SEPTEMBER - NEW PLANTS FROM OLD by Lys de Bray

A long time ago when I worked at Plessey, I was a 'Forward Planner' and I took to the job like a duck to water, even though I was dealing with engineering systems which were a closed book to me. But the principle's the same whether it's electronic systems, eggs on a chicken farm or elephant's feed in a zoo. It's the time scale that matters in every case and so it is in the garden. September's a busy month when we should be thinking about clearing away annuals, buying and planting spring bulbs, collecting ripe seed to finish drying for sowing next spring and lifting and dividing herbaceous plants. With these you may find the central part of the clump is exhausted and if it is have the whole clump out on to a plastic sheet. Choose healthy-looking new shoots from the edge and discard the rest, then plant as many small rooted pieces as you can find to grow on in a spare bit of garden.

It reminds me of the Arabian lamp-seller in the children's story who went through the streets crying: 'New lamps for old' when his original (and magic) lamp was thrown out by his new young wife who thought it too old and shabby to keep. She had a new house and wanted everything in it to be brand-new as well. So the lamp-seller went all through the streets of the town calling out 'New lamps for old!' thinking that this would be a sure way of getting his old lamp back. Now the old lamp was extra-special because a genie lived in it who appeared when it was rubbed, saying: 'What is your will, O master?' and whatever he wanted the genie would get for him, and as you may imagine he was desperate to get his old lamp back. I see a similarity between these little snippets from a worn-out old plant which will grow into lots of new ones - 'New plants from old!' so to speak. Some gardeners are quite fanciful, you may be thinking.

Now, where was I? Oh, yes. September is a month for comfortable forward planning, in tune with nature's own cycle. Stick with that and you won't go wrong, but there's a lot to do, so get busy because soon it'll be Christmas! Here's a suggested to-do list: (1). Clear out annuals: (2) Buy and plant bulbs: (3) Collect seed to finish ripening indoors (maybe not in greenhouse, too humid. (4) Lift, divide and replant the best parts of large old herbaceous plant-clumps. (5) Plant up some large pots of primroses (don't split these) and site to flower where you will see them every day. (6) Get the wallflowers in, some in large pots near the house. (7) Get trays of forget-me-nots to plant with the wallflowers, or you may be lucky enough to have your own seedlings. The plants come in different shades of blue, pink or white and you can have a really nice time working out colour schemes. Make the most of them because their seedlings are unlikely to come true.



Crying the Neck!

Long before I moved to Dorset, I lived in Chiswick, London and sang in my local church choir. For several years, the choir were invited down to Truro, Cornwall for two weeks in the summer to sing services in Truro Cathedral while their own choir were on holiday. As part of this deal, we were asked to sing at several of the tiny rural churches in the surrounding area. One of the services we sang at was in a field just outside Truro and was the service of 'Crying the neck.'

We all marched down the lane from the church, in full robes, behind the cross bearer, into a just-harvested corn field. I remember that the minister started with a prayer and then we sang a hymn accompanied by a very squeaky squeezebox. After the last strains of the hymn had died away, the farmer leapt up and grabbed a large handful of corn

stalks. He then shouted in a loud voice:

"I 'ave 'un! I 'ave 'un! I 'ave 'un!" All the people gathered in the field then shouted, "What 'ave 'ee? What 'ave 'ee? What 'ave 'ee?" and he replied, "A neck! A neck! A neck!" Everyone then shouted "Hurrah! Hurrah for the neck! Hurrah for the farmer."

The minister then said another prayer before we all processed back to the church for the rest of the harvest thanksgiving service.



Apparently, crying the neck was an old tradition in Devon and Cornwall, before the advent of the combine harvester, as the last handful of hay was cut. It was resurrected by the Old Cornwall Society 20 years after the Second World War. It was an experience for us all especially the 14 young boys in the choir. I don't suppose they will have forgotten it.
