

Where do English words originate?



The 20mph limit survey ended in December and we will discuss the results at the January Parish Council meeting and decide on whether to go forward with an application for a 20mph within the Parish. After being assessed by Dorset Council, Jubilee Cross / Wimborne Road has been deemed unsuitable for a Refuge Crossing, due to cost and low footfall but work on the speed limit review is ongoing.

The EV charge point in the Memorial Hall Car Park has been connected and will be operational shortly, hopefully by the time you read the jottings. The WI bench at the end of Millmoor was due to be repaired but has now been taken away as it had completely rotted and we are looking into possibilities for a replacement. We would like to say a big thank you to the local Guides group who have kindly offered to clean up the Telephone Box on Stocks Green in the Spring!

The Parish Council discussed the Dorset Council Community Asset Transfer List, and we have put in a request to take ownership of Charborough Green. Our request has been logged and is being progressed.





Kingston Lacy Estate News

One of the visible changes that marks a changing climate is the blooming of flowers at unfamiliar times of year. Of course, plant breeders have long worked towards extending the seasons, with early-flowering varieties popular sellers; but

there are still surprises. One of the earliest of the 40 or so varieties of snowdrop planted at Kingston Lacy is Three Ships, so called because it is often in flower by Christmas Day. Last year, it was a good three weeks early, and the snowdrops (also known as Candlemass bells because they used to appear round about 2 February) were at their peak in January.



This can play havoc with our event planning, which is done weeks, often months, in advance. Snowdrop walks with one of the gardeners are always popular (their knowledge of the varieties and the management is brilliant), but kind of spoilt if visitors are looking at withered flowers and budding seed heads! So each year in November we indulge in the entirely fruitless game of “guess when the snowdrops will be at their best” in order to get the walks booked into diaries and up on the website. Never work with animals, children – or Mother Nature.

Of course, with so many varieties snowdrop season at Kingston Lacy is longer than most, so there’s (nearly) always something to see. This year looks like the little bulbs will bloom later than last year – though showing through, none are flowering yet. However, we’ve still hedged our bets for the moment and scheduled snowdrop walks for some as-yet-undecided dates between 26 Jan-13 Feb; we’ll confirm the dates nearer the time. Keep an eye on the website or social media if you’re interested.

There are plenty of other events that are nailed down – workshops on photography, stencil printing, wood engraving and linocuts are all up on the website now. There are also spaces coming up on the allotments down by the Kitchen Garden, so maybe 2026 will be your most creative year yet.

Spring Is Just Round January's Corner! by Lys de Bray

January is a good time to give the garden a thorough tidy-up. The deciduous flowering shrubs are barer than usual this year because of those frosts, so you could start with them because there's only a tracery of branches defining their presence. If they are good value as to foliage and flowers then leave them be. I have two delightful 'hardy' fuchsias (no fuchsia is totally hardy except in Cornwall) that dangle pleasingly atop a wall alongside the main stepped path leading to the front door. One is *Fuchsia 'Genii'* which has lime yellow leaves and typical red and purple flowers. It likes this sunny spot and I am well rewarded by its joyful colour. Its leafless branches should be left as they are until late spring as they make good protection for the plant. A bit further along the same wall is a fine specimen of *F. riccartonii magellanica 'Versicolor'* which has pink-toned leaves and smaller red and purple flowers. It makes a rose-coloured mound throughout the entire summer and is good against neighbouring *Rosmarinus officinalis* - rosemary - with its grey-green leaves. The fuchsia will need a certain amount of thinning out but not until late spring. If it survives. Nearby is a surprisingly good fan-palm - *Trachycarpus fortunei* - which has pillows of powerfully scented pale yellow flowers in summer. It is now about 15ft tall and going like a train and may one day rival those at Abbotsbury in stature. Its fans are rigid and stiff, and when summer-green are excellent in large foliage arrangements. Now, though, they are yellow-brown, stiffly dead and must be sawn away. The gravel garden is being ruthlessly weeded and the gravel is clearly visible for once. Gravel is a good growing medium for many plants, and an even better growing medium for weeds, though these pull out very easily. Here there is a mature *Berberis darwinii 'Rose Glow'* which has small maroon pink-spotted leaves turning brilliant crimson for a few short weeks in autumn. It spends the winter as a thorny, twiggy mass and has outgrown its space and its welcome and will be joining the dead fans on the bonfire next week. The day-lily - *hemerocallis* - bed is messy, with dead plant-growth intermixed with weeds and new shoots. The deer love these and ate them to the ground last year, so we have made a smart fence which, alas, has to be left in place all summer as the deer like the flowers too. Last autumn I planted some tulip bulbs that needed a safe new home after spending the summer drying out in the greenhouse. The bulbs didn't look much but nevertheless they went in between the now-protected day-lily tussocks and may provide some early colour. The deer like tulip flowers even more and I didn't want to waste the effort of planting these once-flowered bulbs in the grass. It is different with daffs, the deer don't like them, so we have planted all ex-pot bulbs between the buddlejas, and even if there is not much flower this year, there will be next season. Gardeners have to be optimists! The buddlejas have been lightly pruned to avoid wind-rock; the major pruning-time for them is February when they will be cut right down to about 6 inches. You will have to harden your heart and sharpen the loppers to do this, but I promise it will be worth it. And get seed trays, cuttings-pots and compost ready for action, spring is just around January's corner!
