



# Action Fraud is warning people to provide an extra layer of protection and enable the 2-Step Verification (2SV) option, as more than 33,600 people had their social media or email accounts hacked in the last year.

Data from Action Fraud, the national fraud and cybercrime reporting service, shows that more than 33,600 people reported that their online accounts had been hacked from August last year, with victims losing a total of  $\pounds 1.4$  million.

Action Fraud is launching an awareness campaign on social media and email account hacking for Cyber Security Awareness Month this year, encouraging the public to protect their online accounts from fraudsters.

#### Adam Mercer, Deputy Director of Action Fraud, said:

"Cyber attacks and hacking are carried out by faceless cyber criminals who target unsuspecting victims looking to take advantage of unprotected social media and email accounts. With this being the top cybercrime reported last financial year, it's even more important to take action and ensure you lock down your accounts.

"Protect yourself from fraudsters trying to steal or access your valuable information by ensuring your social media and email account passwords are secure. All your passwords should be different and never shared with anyone else. If you have the option, enable 2-step verification to ensure you have twice the protection for all your accounts."

# In the reports made to Action Fraud, there were various different methods of hacking reported, including:

#### On-platform chain hacking

This is when a fraudster gains control of an account and begins to impersonate the legitimate owner. The goal is to convince people to reveal authentication codes that are sent to them via text. Many victims of this type of hacking believe it's a friend messaging them, however the shared code was associated with their own account and the impersonator can now use it to access their account. Usually when an account is taken over, fraudsters monetise control of the account via the promotion of various fraudulent schemes, while impersonating the original account owner.

#### Leaked passwords and phishing

The other predominant method of hacking reported is leaked information used from data breaches, such as leaked passwords, or account details gained via phishing scams. This becomes prevalent as people often use the same password for multiple accounts, so a leaked password from one website can leave many of their online accounts vulnerable to hacking.

#### What can you do to avoid being a victim?

Use a strong and different password for your email and social media accounts. Your email and social media passwords should be strong and different from all your other passwords. Combining three random words that each mean something to you is a great way to create a password that is easy to remember but hard to crack.

Turn on 2-Step Verification (2SV) for your email and social media accounts. 2-Step Verification (2SV) gives you twice the protection, so even if cyber criminals have your password, they can't access your email or social media account. 2SV works by asking for more information to prove your identity. For example, getting a code sent to your phone when you sign in using a new device or change settings such as your password. You won't be asked for this every time you check your email or social media.

If you live in England, Wales and Northern Ireland and have been a victim of fraud or cybercrime, report it at www.actionfraud.police.uk or by calling 0300 123 2040. In Scotland, victims of fraud and cybercrime should report to Police Scotland on 101.

## VE Day May 8th 1945

80 years ago, on 8th May the second world



war in Europe finally came to end. V.E. day (Victory in Europe Day) was celebrated all across Europe and in North America. Crowds massed in Trafalgar Square and up the Mall to Buckingham Palace, where King George VI and Queen Elizabeth, accompanied by the Prime Minister Winston Churchill, appeared on the balcony of the Palace to cheering



crowds.

Amongst those crowds Princess Elizabeth (the future Queen Elizabeth II) and her sister, Princess Margaret blended anonymously,

apparently enjoying the celebrations for themselves first hand.

V.E. day marked the end of six years of fighting and loss of life but eventually the Nazi scourge was crushed and the war in Europe was over.

The Allies had originally agreed to mark 9th May 1945 as VE day, but eager western journalists broke the news of Germany's surrender prematurely, thus signaling the earlier celebration. The Soviets kept to the agreed date, and Russia still commemorates the end of the Second World War, known in Russia as the Great Patriotic War, as Victory Day on 9th May.

The Allied victory over Japan, known as VJ Day, did not take place until some months later on 15th August 1945. This surrender of Japan came after two Atomic bombs were dropped by the United States first on Hiroshima with an estimated loss of life reaching 200,000



and the second on Nagasaki with a further 200,000 deaths.



### **Kingston Lacy Estate News**

Recent sunny weather has provided an excellent start for butterfly and insect populations as they emerge from eggs, pupae, larval stage or dormancy, and out on the Kingston Lacy estate we have already witnessed an increase in numbers to support this.



With drier, sunnier weather insects can take advantage of more abundant, early nectar sources. One example is cowslips, which are a vital nectar source for all insects but particularly brimstone and green hairstreak butterflies.

A sunny spring is crucial in the early stages in butterfly and insect development to enable a successful foraging and breeding year. In the last few years, spring has been wetter and less settled, resulting in more unpredictable conditions for insects. T his year, we have already recorded almost twice as many as last year in terms of both species and number. Species spotted include Brimstone, Small Tortoiseshell, Peacock

and Speckled Wood. However, we will not have the full results until the end of the year.

Of course, conservation work throughout the whole year is important in encouraging the local insect population: grazing, hay cutting and regenerative farming all play a part. Thicker, denser hedgerows, such as those around Bishops Court Farm, provide good places for species to lay eggs and over-winter in safety. An abundance of wild flowers in the summer keeps food plentiful. As our conservation work develops we look forward to seeing growing numbers of the butterflies and insects that are such an important part of the wider landscape around us.

At Kingston Lacy itself, we are welcoming lots of new life with the joyful arrival of the latest batch of Portland lambs (pop in on 26 and 27 April to join a drop in session and meet some) and Red Ruby Devon calves, which you'll see out in the parkland before long. In the garden, the cherry blossom continues its annual show, and bookings have opened for the summer outdoor theatre; we've got Macbeth, Twelfth Night and, for a family audience, the ever-popular Illyria with The Wind in the Willows. Check the website for details.

This is a great opportunity for you to come along and hear what he has to say and raise any issues you may have in person. The Police and the Memorial Hall Committee will also be in attendance. The Annual Litter Pick took place on Saturday 6<sup>th</sup> April, <del>and</del> it was well supported and a great success. A big thank to everyone who came along, we were lucky as the weather was kind again. A large amount of litter was collected, and this was removed by Dorset Waste Partnership.

There will be Maypole Dancing on Maypole Green again on Monday 5<sup>th</sup> May. Please go along and support them, it is so lovely to see this tradition being maintained. You may notice that the Maypole has become shorter. This is because we had an inspection and were advised to remove the top 3 metres of the pole, because it had brown rot. We will be replacing the pole in its entirety later this year, at the same time the weathervane is going to be refurbished along with the metal work around it.

We had a meeting with Dorset Council Highways and Cllr Chakawhata last month regarding concerns about speeding on Mill Lane and placing traffic lights on White Mill Bridge. Unfortunately, it is very unlikely that traffic lights will be located here for various reasons, one being the very high cost. Highways have agreed to put SLOW signs on the road near the recently placed Cattle signs. We have also asked about moving the village sign 'Welcome to Sturminster Marshall' nearer to White Mill Bridge to make drivers aware they are coming into the village.

Several residents have contacted the Parish Council about parking issues on the High Street in the vicinity of the Premier shop. We share your concerns, and both the Parish Council and Cllr Chakawhata have been in contact with Dorset Council to try to resolve this. Unfortunately, contractor parking was agreed as part of the planning permission, limiting our options to change anything.

We have purchased two metal Silent Soldiers, and we will be sorting out installing them where the previous statue stood. We are going to ask permission from Dorset Council to tidy the area and possibly sow wild poppy seeds.



#### Pismires\* - by Lys de Bray

Everyone knows what an ant looks like, so there's no need to describe them here. Their sizes and colours vary according to their species and habitat, and they are fascinating creatures with many little-known habits. The small black ant Lasius niger is the one we know best. It lives in nests underground, and it sometimes comes indoors in an attempt to take up residence in the larder, should you be lucky enough to have one. Larders are rare these days where space is so precious, and the modem store cupboard is a barren desert of sealed packets and closed jars compared with the larders of yesteryear with their rich odours .of home-made jams, marmalades, pickles, sauces, cakes and puddings. (my mother, pre- WWII, would make pounds and pounds of marmalades and jams which went into those 71b 'stone' jars which we now cherish and use for flowers because their rough greyish appearance suits the flowers so well) Note: cherish the ones you've got because there won't be any more. The life story of an ant is absolutely fascinating and there are several different species whose appearance and habits vary. Beginning at the beginning the common black ant Formica fusca is the one we see most often. It lives in n nests underground and it eats almost anything, fallen fruit, dead animals, dead insects seeds, flower-nectar, honeydew, pollen, and each other. Ants have wings and can fly, once. his is the nuptial flight when queens and drones fly together. The drones mate with the queens and die, their job is done. The fertilised queens will have received enough sperm to last for their lifetime and return to earth where she divests herself of her wings which she later eats, because they contain the (edible) degenerating muscles that enabled her to fly. Worker-ants build a nest where she will stay for the rest of her life laying eggs and being cared for by her offspring. At the right time of year the eggs will hatch into larvae that the worker ants will care for and the larvae respond to this care by producing a substance the worker ants feed on. Ants also act as 'farmers', capturing aphids which they put on nearby plants and later 'milk.

**Note:** I'm writing about British ants: Other countries in other climes have differently coloured and larger or smaller ants. Ants have no hesitation in going to war and one species, the red ant *-Formica sanguinia* -kidnaps the pupae of other ant species and drags them back to the nest where it tends them until they hatch and then they are then treated as slaves.

I remember that as a child in Kent, before WWII we used to go on picnics, often to a favourite place called 'One Tree Hill.' I was being a nuisance, getting in the way of the grown-ups; and after I'd kicked the milk-jug over my legs were slapped and I was plonked on a little mound nearby and told on no account to move and if I did there would be no cake . I started to cry but stopped when I felt something tickling my legs and when I looked down, to my horror they were covered in little black ants. I had been plonked on an ant-hill. The sight of the ants running up my legs was so awful that I couldn't scream because I couldn't breathe, but when I could I screamed so loudly that my mother (who had been getting out a thermos of hot tea dropped it to rush over to me, saw what was happening and plucked me off the little mound which had turned out to be an anthill. She stripped off my dress and my shoes and socks which she used t to scrub the ants off my legs. That picnic was not a success and for years afterwards I had nightmares involving ants.


